

Discovering My Learning Style

This lesson is designed to help students discover how they learn and remember information best, and how understanding their learning style can help them succeed in school and a career.

OBJECTIVES

Students will...

1. Learn about the three learning styles
2. Identify how they learn and remember information best
3. Explore how their learning style can help them in school and on the job

ACTIVITIES

PART 1

Content Knowledge

Lead a class discussion around learning styles and ask students the following questions:

1. What is a learning style?
2. How does knowing your learning style help you succeed in school and in a career?

PART 2

Applying Information

Read the options for A, B, and C to the class. Ask students to take notes on which option they most identify with.

A. Do you:

- Use visual objects such as graphs, charts, pictures, and diagrams?
- Read body language well?
- Memorize and recall information easily?
- Learn better by watching?
- Remember things that are written down?

B. Do you:

- Read materials out loud?
- Retain information through speaking and listening?
- Participate in class discussion?

C. Do you:

- Demonstrate how to do something rather than explain it?
- Prefer group work?
- Prefer a hands-on approach to learn new things?

LESSON PLAN

Next, ask students:

- Which do you think best describes the way you learn a new skill or concept: A, B, or C?
- Is there a time you used a combination of methods?
- In that case, why do you think a different learning method was helpful in that circumstance?
- Share the learning types below with the students:
 - A = Visual (watching and reading)
 - B = Auditory (listening and speaking)
 - C = Tactile (hands-on and physical activity)

Explain to the students that everyone uses different strategies and methods to help them learn.

PART 3

Evaluating Information

Direct students to log in to MEFA Pathway and complete the *Learning Styles* assessment in their *Digital Portfolio* by clicking *TAKE THE TEST* in the white *GET TO KNOW YOURSELF* box. After completing the assessment, students should update their result in their *Digital Portfolio*.

PART 4

Critical Thinking/Creative Application

Have students create a digital poster, diagram, presentation, or drawing highlighting their current preferred learning style and identifying any aspects of other learning styles they would like to try.

After completion, students should upload the project to their *Document Library* on their MEFA Pathway *Dashboard*.
